### **ROOTS**

For 60 years, KOOTASCA Community Action, Inc. has been a reliable force for positive change. Founded in 1965 during the launch of the national Community Action movement, we were built on a foundation of local governance, grassroots engagement, and poverty reduction.

Over the decades, we have evolved to meet the unique needs of rural communities, embracing new challenges while remaining steadfast in our commitment to equity and opportunity.

### **REACH**

With a primary office in Grand Rapids and an additional footprint in International Falls, KOOTASCA covers an extensive geographic area and manages an annual budget of \$10 million with a diverse portfolio of federal, state, and private funding. The organization's tripartite board of directors ensures a balanced governance model, drawing voices from elected officials, community stakeholders, and low-income residents. This ensures that KOOTASCA's programs are shaped by the people it serves and centered on promoting the interest of those experiencing poverty.

Our 100 staff members, many with long tenures, work across multiple sites within Itasca and Koochiching counties to deliver programs that address both immediate needs and long-term stability. Through services like early childhood education, housing support, and crisis assistance, we reach more than 3,500 households annually helping individuals and families create pathways to a better future.



## ABOUT OUR AREA

KOOTASCA Community Action serves the expansive and diverse regions of Itasca County and Koochiching County, two rural areas in northern Minnesota. These counties encompass a blend of scenic natural landscapes, strong communities, and unique challenges, making the role of Executive Director both impactful and deeply rewarding.

Itasca County - Nestled in Minnesota's Northwoods, Itasca County is home to Grand Rapids, KOOTASCA's headquarters and the region's largest city. With over 1,000 lakes and vast forestlands, it offers a blend of rural charm and small-town vibrancy. Its 45,000 residents benefit from industries like forestry, healthcare, education, and manufacturing, alongside a strong emphasis on arts, outdoor living, and community engagement.

Koochiching County - Bordering Canada, Koochiching County features International Falls, KOOTASCA's secondary office location and the gateway to Voyageurs National Park. Known as the "Icebox of the Nation," the county's 12,000 residents thrive in industries such as paper manufacturing, tourism, and cross-border trade, creating a close-knit community ideal for KOOTASCA's mission to foster opportunity and connection.

Together, these counties represent a dynamic and interconnected region where KOOTASCA works to address systemic barriers, build stronger communities, and foster sustainable development.

## LIVING AND WORKING IN GRAND RAPIDS

While the Executive Director's work spans both counties, Grand Rapids is KOOTASCA's organizational and cultural hub. Nestled in Itasca County, it offers a vibrant mix of natural beauty, small-town charm, and urban amenities, with abundant opportunities for recreation, education, and economic activity.



Grand Rapids is ideal for outdoor enthusiasts, with access to over 1,000 lakes and year-round activities like hiking, biking, fishing, snowmobiling, and skiing. The city's thriving arts scene features the Reif Performing Arts Center, local galleries, and the Judy Garland Museum. Known for its family-friendly environment, Grand Rapids offers excellent schools, safe neighborhoods, and lifelong learning opportunities through Itasca Community College. Its diverse economy, driven by healthcare, education, tourism, and forestry, is complemented by a lively downtown with shops, restaurants, and cultural attractions.

community Action Agencies (CAAs) are local organizations founded to combat poverty by empowering communities to address issues of economic inequality and to provide resources like job training, housing assistance, and education. Sargent Shriver played a crucial role in establishing CAAs as part of the War on Poverty during the 1960s, envisioning them as a way to give communities direct control over federal resources to tackle local poverty challenges.
